A Reminder from the Office of the Town Clerk: Dog License Requirement

Veterinarians administering Rabies vaccines provide owner names, physical addresses and all specific information regarding canine patients to Town Officials of the municipality that the owner resides in.

Town of Russell's General By-Laws provide: Article 7 – Regulations for Keeping of Dogs and Other Animals

Section 5. Fees and Fines:

b) Any person who fails to obtain a license in accordance with Section 3 above shall be subject to a late fine of five (\$5.00) dollars per dog. Any person who fails to pay a late fine and license a dog by December 1, will be fined twenty-five (\$25.00) per dog in addition to the regular licensing fee. Failure to license any dog may result in court action. Please visit the Russell Town Clerk's office to license your dog and avoid late fees and penalties.



Register Now for FREE Table Runner Workshop

The Russell Cultural Council and the Mass Cultural Council recently awarded a grant to town resident Dale Oleksak to lead a FREE sewing workshop designed to introduce community members to the joy of quilting.



Using supplied materials, participants will make a colorful table runner using a variation of the "Mini Brick Road" pattern by Atkinson Designs. The workshop will be held in the Community Room of the Russell Senior Center and will meet Monday mornings over a three-week period. The class will take place from 10 am to 12 noon on June 17; June 24 and July 8.

Sewing machines will be available for use as well as a limited number of rotary cutters and

Sewing machines will be available for use as well as a limited number of rotary cutters and cutting mats. Participants are welcome to bring their own machines and tools if desired. They should bring their own flathead sewing pins, a seam ripper (mistakes do happen!), and trim-

ming tools (acrylic rulers specifically made for rotary cutting). Pattern, fabric, thread and cotton batting will be provided.
